Kiwi's host first ever Flash Fiction Portrush

THE first ever Flash Fiction Portrush, the new younger sibling of Flash Fiction Armagh, took place on Friday, March 21.

Writers read their work to a large and enthusiastic audience at the inaugural event in Kiwi's Brew Bar, at the resort's Main Street.

Flash Fiction Events differ from other Open Mic events in that the readers are selected ahead of time, based on submission quality.

Both of the Flash Fiction Events held in Northern Ireland, in Armagh and now Portrush, are based on Flash Fiction Forum in San Jose, California, where these events are held four times annually.

Entries were encouraged from both new and experienced writers, resulting in an unexpected

number of submissions for a first-time event.

Eleven stories were chosen. While many of these writers came from the local area, some travelled quite a distance by car, including from Armagh and Donegal.

The unexpected crisis at Heathrow did not cause the problems it could have done for three of the performers.

During the evening the writers/performers were voted for by the audience with three readers going forward to be published in the next Impspired Press Online Magazine and its subsequent print volume.
